AP 5140 DISABLED STUDENT PROGRAMS AND SERVICES (DSPS)

The District maintains a plan for the provision of programs and services to disabled students designed to assure that they have equality of access to District classes and programs.

The District does not discriminate on the basis of disability in any of its policies, procedures or practices, including admission and access to programs. Inquiries or complaints should be directed to the EEO Officer.

The District offers programs and services on and/or off campus for students with disabilities pursuant to Title 5. In accordance with Title 5, students with disabilities who, because of educational limitations secondary to a verified disability cannot benefit from general education classes, activities and services provided by the college without specific specialized services and/or educational programs.

The District maintains a Disability Support Programs and Services (DSPS) Plan for the provision of programs and services to students with disabilities designed to ensure that they have equality of access to District classes and programs.

The DSPS Plan addresses the following:

- long-range goals and short term measurable objectives for the program
- definitions of disabilities and students eligible for the program
- support services and instruction
- verification of disability
- student rights and responsibilities
- academic accommodation plan that is developed by the DSPS Coordinator or designee in consultation with the student
- academic adjustments, auxiliary aids and services
- provisions for course substitution and waivers
- staffing
- advisory committee

The plan is maintained and updated by the DSPS Coordinator.
