AP 5150 EXTENDED OPPORTUNITY PROGRAMS AND SERVICES (EOPS)

Both Colleges provide a comprehensive Extended Opportunity Programs and Services (EOPS) Program. Please see the respective college catalog for specific program services and details.

The Extended Opportunity Programs and Services (EOPS) is established to provide support services and programs to assist eligible students who have language, social, and economic disadvantages to succeed academically. EOPS support services and programs are provided in addition to the traditional student services programs.

Under the direction of the Dean, Counseling and Student Support Programs, the EOPS Director develops and implements an annual program plan that includes the following programs and services:

- (A) Staffing and program management
- (B) Documentation and data collection system
- (C) An EOPS advisory committee

- (D) A full time director
- (E) Eligibility criteria
- (F) Student responsibility requirements
- (G) Recruitment and outreach services
- (H) Advising, orientation services and registration assistance
- (I) Seminars, workshops and tutorial assistance
- (J) Counseling and retention services
- (K) Career employment services
- (L) Transfer services
- (M) Direct aid
- (N) Establishment of objectives to achieve the goals in implementing extended opportunity programs and services
- (O) Review and evaluation of the programs and services and submission of related reports

The Dean, Counseling and Support Programs shall assure that the EOPS plan is submitted annually to the California Community College Chancellors Office and that the program conforms to all requirements established by the relevant law and regulations.
