1. Categorize and express food orders, express likes and dislikes, and request the check in Spanish
2. Compare and contrast Spanish and Latin American foods
3. Appraise instructions on a recipe and formulate instructions for a recipe
4. Organize and relate childhood activities orally and in a written composition
5. Analyze and compare family relationships and express past activities
6. Contrast various climates and geographical areas
7. Appraise different forms of transportation and road signs to plan trips in Spanish-speaking countries
8. Evaluate problems and solutions dealing with the environment
9. Give directions and/or ask for directions when traveling
10. Examine travel brochures describing accommodations, price, location, transportation
11. Relate travel experiences in the past orally and in a written composition
12. Listen and respond to softened commands (subjunctive) and formulate softened commands
13. Appraise the different functions of body parts and internal organs
14. Identify illnesses and remedies; describe symptoms to doctor/nurse
15. Create a composition about an accident where people were hurt
16. Analyze and contrast the materials of which items are made, in both oral and written form.
17. Examine the currencies of all Latin American countries and Spain
18. Solve mathematical calculations using numbers from 1000 to 150,000,000
19. Experiment with negotiating skills when buying clothes, food and souvenirs
20. Identify individual shops in Hispanic neighborhoods
21. Compare and evaluate family relationships in the Hispanic culture
22. Give, ask for and receive advice and suggestions in formal and informal registers orally and in writing

24. Analyze and evaluate social issues within the context of Hispanic culture in the USA
