







#### FISCAL REPORTING TIMELINE


PUBLIC HEARING







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


#### FY21-22 GENERAL FUND: EXPENSES BY LOCATION



#### FY21-22 GENERAL FUND: EXPENSES BY MAJOR AREAS




#### FY21-22 GENERAL FUND EXPENSES: COMPENSATION BY GROUP

SAN JOSÉ, CALIFORNIA – Evergreen Valley College (EVC) today announced the renewal of its Talent Search grant through the US Department of Education, which amounts to \$404,413 per year and equates to over \$2.0 million dollars over the span of five years.

EVC's TRiO Talent Search program is one of more than 700 TRiO programs nationwide that promote academic achievement among disadvantaged populations. TRiO Talent Search at EVC is a free, federally-funded program that serves four target high schools in San Jose, helping low-income and potential first-generation students successfully graduate from secondary school and enroll in post-secondary education.

"Evergreen Valley College's TRiO Talent Search program is such an important pathway for high school students to receive tutoring, guidance, and support in helping them prepare for college," said Tammeil Y. Gilkerson, Evergreen Valley College President. "We are so grateful for the opportunity to continue supporting hundreds of youth in our region, and to have five more years to keep impacting lives."
